Contaminated Site Remediation & Redevelopment (CSRR) is pleased to announce updates to the UST Cost Guidance Document, effective February 1, 2026.

The updated UST Fund Cost Guide rates are applicable to funding requests received by CSRR on or after February 1, 2026. All funding requests that were approved by the DEP and EDA prior to February 1, 2026, are subject to the January 1, 2010, UST Fund Cost Guide rates. All previously approved applications (applications where the EDA has approved funding) will have costs submitted and reviewed (for example, invoices and subcontractor invoices) utilizing the UST Fund Cost Guide in effect at the time of their approval. All applications that have already been submitted to CSRR may not be withdrawn for the purpose of revising the cost proposals.
